

Code of Conduct

Champion Sporting Events is a non-affiliated sporting organization that is committed to offering competitive sporting events in a safe, enjoyable environment where its participants and spectators are expected to conduct themselves with integrity.

Participants agree to:

- Play by the rules
- Display good sportsmanship always.
- Avoid offensive language and control my temper
- Educate myself and follow the rules of the facility and event host
- Display honesty when having to participate in officiating duties
- Not verbally or non-verbally harass, abuse or taunt officials, participants, staff and spectators
- Respect the rights, dignity and worth of all participants regardless of their gender, ability, cultural background or religion
- If a sanctioned event, agree to abide by the rules of the governing organization
- Not use or possess drugs, alcohol, fireworks, ammunition, firearms, knives or any item or material that can be used as a weapon, to any of the participants or athletes and shall report anyone using or in the possession of the same. State laws prohibit the use of alcohol by anyone under the age of twenty-one.
- Not Damage or destroy any facilities or personal property of others at an CSE Event.
- Not Violate facility or hotel rules or policies
- Not Violate any federal, state, or local laws while at an CSE Event.
- Cooperate with any CSE related investigation, review or effort to address any potential or actual violation of this Code.
- Provide notice of a suspected violation of this Code by notifying the event directors of tournament Committee of the circumstances giving rise to the suspected violation.

Violations

Participants that fail to abide by this Code are subject to disciplinary action/sanctions, in accord with the procedures described in this Code.

The disciplinary action/sanctions that the offender and/or the offender's team may be subject to include, but are not limited to:

- Penalties in accordance with rules of play outlined for each sport
 - Forfeiting sets and/or matches/games
 - Ejection from game or venue
 - Denying awards that recognize team or player achievements;
 - Prohibiting entry into subsequent CSE events;
- Other appropriate actions or sanctions.
